The Public Choice Outreach Conference is a series of compact lectures in Public Choice for students planning careers in academia, business, law, etc. Students are introduced to the history and basic tools of public choice analysis, such as models of voting and elections, and models of government and legislative organization. Students also learn to apply public choice theory to a wide range of relevant issues. Finally, students will be introduced to "constitutional economics" and the economics of rule making.
